Please read the following passage carefully and answer the questions that follow (Q6-8).

To clean a ceiling fan effectively, start by turning off the fan and ensuring it's not operational to prevent accidents. Place a step stool or ladder under the fan to safely reach it. Next, remove any loose dust from the blades using a feather duster or a dry microfiber cloth, gently wiping from the center of the fan outward to the tip of each blade.

For a deeper clean, create a cleaning solution by mixing warm water with a mild detergent. Dampen a soft cloth with the solution and carefully wipe down each blade, including the top surface which often accumulates the most dust. Be careful not to let any liquid drip into the motor housing.

If the fan has light fixtures or globes, remove these and wash them in soapy water. Be sure to rinse and dry them thoroughly before reattaching to ensure no water spots remain. If the globes are made of glass, handle them with extra care to avoid breakage.

After cleaning, dry all parts of the fan with a clean, dry cloth. Reassemble the fan and light fixtures if you've taken them apart. Finally, turn the fan back on and enjoy a cleaner, more efficient airflow in your room.
